“InSight is the first mission to explore Mars’ deep interior... it will investigate processes that shaped the rocky planets of the inner solar system more than four billion years ago.” (NASA Mission Overview)

[I]n sight is tasked with a similar goal as the NASA mission with a suspiciously similar name. Throughout the process we discussed the end of the world, outer space and what is yet to come for six young people embarking on the next phase of their lives. We began with thirty instructions and two stipulations;

1. Each instruction produces a movement
2. The phrase of movements must be in the order I wrote it

From these thirty rules came six rich, engaging and diverse solos which was then crafted into this piece. Along with text written by the dancers, this work engages with the idea of existence and how we act as leaders and followers, outsiders and insiders, speakers and listeners. I am deeply inspired by these six individuals and how they grew together and this work is a reflection of that.

CHOREOGRAPHERS

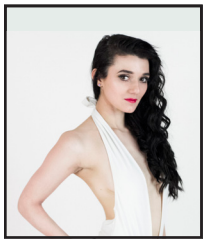

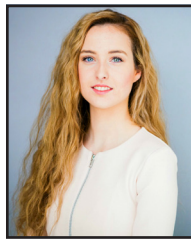


PERFORMERS
